

CITY OF DOVER ORDINANCE #2023-06

1 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DOVER, IN**
2 **COUNCIL MET:**

4 That Chapter 106 – TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES, Article I – IN GENERAL, be amended by inserting
5 the text indicated in bold, blue font and deleting the text indicated in red strikethrough as follows:

7 **Section 106-17 – Truck routes.**

8
9 (a) Except as hereinafter provided, no commercial vehicle having three or more axles shall be
10 operated on any street in the city except on a “truck route”.

11 (b) The following roads are designated as “truck routes” within the city:

- 12 (1) U.S. Route 13;
- 13 (2) Bay Road;
- 14 (3) Governors Avenue;
- 15 (4) Saulsbury Road;
- 16 (5) Dover-Kenton Road;
- 17 (6) Persimmon Tree Lane;
- 18 (7) Delaware Route 1;
- 19 (8) Scarborough Road;
- 20 (9) McKee Road;
- 21 (10) South Little Creek Road;
- 22 (11) Leipsic Road;
- 23 (12) Denny’s Road
- 24 (13) Delaware Route 8;
- 25 (14) North Street **(from Mifflin Road to South Governors Avenue);**
- 26 (15) ~~New Burton Road~~ **POW/MIA Parkway;**
- 27 (16) White Oak Road-;
- 28 (17) **Hazletville Road;**

29 (c) This section shall not apply to any commercial vehicles with three or more axles:

- 30 (1) Making a local delivery to or a pickup from a place in the city incapable of being
31 directly accessed from a designated “truck route”. The driver must have available
32 proof of intended place of delivery or pickup and:
 - 33 a. If entering the city limits, the driver shall use the most direct practical route
34 from a designated truck route to and from the delivery or pickup, and
 - 35 b. If originating from within the city limits, the driver shall use the most direct
36 practical route to and from the place of delivery or pickup within the city and/or
37 the most direct practical route to a designated “truck route” if going outside the
38 city limits.
- 39 (2) Owned by or leased to the city or any volunteer fire company or emergency response
40 organization when engaged in official business, including, by way of example, those
41 vehicles of any fire department or any police department or agency, or to any town or
42 state public works department or agency.

- 43 (3) Owned by, leased to, or operated by any public utility company (or its subcontractor)
- 44 while engaged in public utility operations.
- 45 (4) Garbage and solid waste haulers in the course of their business operations.
- 46 (5) Operated on any city street officially designated as a detour route where such vehicle
- 47 could otherwise be lawfully operated upon the street for which such detour is
- 48 established.

56 This ordinance updates the current truck routes within the city. Additional roads have been constructed
57 within the city limits that were designed for truck traffic. Other streets within the city are residential in
58 nature and do not provide a proper safety environment for the trucks and residents.
